

GROUND REGULATIONS OF THE HUNGARIAN BASKETBALL FEDERATION



- By purchasing a ticket or season ticket, by receiving other proof of entry or by applying for entry to the sporting event, the participant accepts the rules of the sporting event.
- A participant may be admitted to and remain at the venue of a sporting event if:
 - have a valid ticket, pass or other proof of access (e.g. invitation, accreditation, etc.) for the sector reserved for them;
 - approaches his/her seat, sector and place of work on the route designated to him/her and stays there in accordance with the instructions laid down in advance;
 - occupies only the space indicated on his/her ticket/rental/invite/accreditation and uses only the facilities and service units specified for him/her;
 - undertakes to:
 - provide proof of identity when requested to do so by the person responsible for ticket sales of the organiser or the organiser;
 - search the clothing, luggage, supporters' or personal belongings of the organiser;
 - dispose of objects that cannot be brought in, in accordance with the instructions of the organiser and the contributors;
 - comply with the provisions of the rules of the course, additional regulations set by the organiser, and the instructions and requests of the organiser, the director, the co-director and the police;
 - does not litter and respects the rules on smoking;
 - does not jeopardise the order and conduct of the sporting event, the safety of persons and property of the participants in the sporting event, and the built infrastructure of the facility;
 - carry out commercial activities only with the prior written consent of the organiser;
 - transmit information about the sporting event, its results and certain events only with the prior written consent of the organiser or on the basis of a contract, including in particular information transmitted to sports betting operators and on-line sports betting data providers and their subcontractors, as well as recordings concerning the event's property rights.
- not available:
 - under Section 73 of Act I of 2004 on the Criminal Code (hereinafter: Stv.), exclusion under Section 73 of Act C of 2012 on the Criminal Code, prohibition from attending sporting events under Section 73 of Act II of 2012 on offences, offence proceedings and the offence registration system, and under the decision of a foreign sports organisation, authority or court on a similar injunction under Section 76/A (1);
 - obviously under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other intoxicating substances;
- does not engage in anti-sporting, anti-community, violent conduct that is incompatible with good sportsmanship and is likely to cause offence or alarm to others;
- acknowledges that:
 - may be removed from the vicinity of the event site and entry points by the police officers and organisers;
 - during the sporting event, it may be filmed and recorded and the organiser, contracted partners and accredited photographers may use and publish the recordings for their own and business purposes;
 - may be relocated for the safety of his/her person and property, may be given a predetermined place of residence during a match;
 - the police - or, in the absence of the police, the organiser - may decide to detain him or her in order to ensure his or her safe departure;
 - may leave the sports facility only at the pre-designated exit point, unless otherwise decided by the organiser, the organiser, the participant or the police;
 - leave the event immediately at the request of the organiser, the organiser's representative or the organiser or at the request of the participant.
- The viewer:**
 - must comply with the safety regulations set by the organiser and the rules of the course;
 - not engage in any activity that disrupts, interferes with, or threatens the personal rights or property of participants in, or those arriving at or leaving the sporting event;
 - is liable to pay damages for the breach of its obligations or for the damage resulting from the breach of its obligations in accordance with the rules of the Civil Code, or to pay compensation in accordance with the general rules on liability for damages;
 - is jointly and severally liable with any other spectator who is a party to the infringement;
 - liability for damages does not affect the viewer's liability for infringements or criminal liability.
- A spectator may enter or remain at the venue of a sporting event if.**
 - you don't have it on you:
 - food, drink and intoxicating substances;
 - an object that is difficult to handle, cannot fit under a chair, endangers the conduct of the sporting event, endangers the safety of others, disturbs the players or officials, or interferes with the enjoyment of other spectators;
 - equipment that could be used for an act of violence or the possession of which is prohibited by law or the organiser of the sports event;
 - signs, flags, clothing, or signs, flags or clothing that incite hatred towards others, have political content or offend others;
 - an object whose interpretation is not clear, or whose interpretation has not been presented to the organiser in advance;
 - wears an authoritarian symbol or clothing prohibited by law, or has a tattoo with this content;
 - pyrotechnic articles, articles capable of being used in a flammable activity, the possession of which is contrary to fire safety rules;
 - lasers or other similar beacons harmful to health and transmission, or noise-making devices prohibited by the organiser;
 - an object for promotional or commercial purposes;
 - video camera or professional camera;
 - 1.11. a pet, except for a disabled spectator, an assistance dog.
 - undertakes to:
 - does not climb or stay on the fences or other objects of the establishment;
 - display and wear only the official national flags of the competing teams and the official club flags and emblems of the competing club teams;
 - flags display only the names of the official cities of the country;
 - to send in advance to the organiser, or to agree to the prior control of the organiser and the organiser's intermediary, the introduction of flags, banners and supporters' symbols larger than 2x1 m;
 - displaying the choreography only with the permission of the organiser;
 - you are in the sector or seat indicated on your ticket, pass or other proof of admission;
 - does not throw any object onto the playing field, into an area out of the spectators' reach or onto persons in the vicinity;
 - does not enter the playing field or areas closed to spectators without permission and does not attempt to engage in such behaviour;
 - national, official or competition-related anthems are not disturbed;
 - do not stop on an escape route (e.g. on the steps of a sports facility), leaving escape routes, corridors, entrances and emergency exits clear;
 - does not engage in racist, hateful, offensive, ideological, religious or political conduct, or display or engage in any signage or conduct with such content;
 - place banners, flags on fences, railings, poles only with the permission of the organiser and the organiser;
 - does not disturb the view of others by its cheering and behaviour;
 - does not cover his or her face, except for public health reasons, to ensure that his or her identity is always guaranteed.
- The organiser - or the organiser if a director is used - and the representative of the travelling sports organisation are entitled to observe and record the participants during the sporting event with a camera of a quality that allows the individual identification of the participants, in order to ensure the safety of the participants and their property. The data processed using the camera systems will be stored for a period of 60 days if necessary to initiate or conduct any exclusion or other official procedure. If no such request is received, the recordings will be destroyed after 120 hours. Camera recordings will be handled in the manner detailed in the data management notice.
- Any person who resists a lawful measure taken by a police officer or a director to maintain order by force or threat, enters or attempts to enter an area which is closed to spectators or a specific group of spectators, or throws into such an area an object which endangers the holding of the sports event or the physical integrity of others, commits an offence.
- The organiser shall order the participant who endangers the holding of the sporting event or the personal safety and property of others, or who engages in racist, hate-mongering, political, fear-mongering or offensive behaviour, not related to fair sportsmanship, to stop such behaviour through the organiser, the contributor or other persons authorised by the organiser.
- If a participant or person applying for entry fails to comply with the conditions set out in the rules of the event or commits an offence during the event and does not stop when warned by the organiser, he/she shall be refused entry or removed from the event.
- If the person to be removed fails to comply with the request, the organiser shall, unless otherwise provided by law, immediately notify the police in order to verify the identity of the person to be removed. Until the arrival of the police, but not later than the end of the third hour following the notification, the director may detain the person to be removed, provided that the detention takes place within the field of vision of the image recording device operating on the premises. The director shall also have the right to detain the person detained if this is necessary for the preparation and communication of the exclusion decision to be imposed on the person detained.
- Anyone who has been removed from a sporting event or who has not been removed because the organiser (director)'s intervention at the venue of the sporting event was likely to result in spectator action that would have disproportionately endangered the safety of the sporting event, will be excluded from participation in the sporting event. Anyone who otherwise violates the rules of the course may also be excluded.
- The organiser shall ensure the documented receipt of objects that cannot be taken in under the rules of the course, provided that their possession does not contravene the law, their safe keeping and their return to the rightful claimant upon departure. Food, drinks and medication may not be taken into safekeeping. If the owner fails to report within one week of the end of the sports event, the organiser or the organiser shall not be obliged to ensure the continued safekeeping of the object and the owner or any other person shall have no further claim, whether pecuniary or non-pecuniary, against the organiser or the organiser.
- The organiser has taken out liability insurance for persons holding tickets, season tickets or invitations and other proof of entry for matches covered by the Government Decree on the security of sporting events, and the existence of such insurance is indicated on tickets and season tickets for sporting events.
- If the sporting event is cancelled, or if the event has been held with the exclusion of spectators or with a restriction on the number of spectators, the ticket price will be refunded within three working days. If the sporting event has been interrupted, the ticket and, if sold, the season ticket will be valid for the repeated event.
- In the case of an access control system, the organiser may also require the issue of a card with a photo identification and entitlement to discounts (hereinafter referred to as „club card“). Club cards, season tickets and season tickets may not be sold to a person registered with the sporting authorities to the venue of a sporting event or to a sporting facility under a prohibition, ban or exclusion order, or, as a travelling sports organisation, to a sporting facility at the venue of a sporting event, whether domestic or foreign.
- Interpretative provisions in relation to these rules:
 - Organiser: the national sports organisation in the case of sporting events organised by the National Association of Hungarian Basketball Players in competitive systems. In the case of national team matches, the Hungarian Cup Final and other sporting events organised by the national association of basketball clubs, the national association of basketball clubs.
 - Sports event participant: a natural person who is present at the venue of a sports event during its duration. A spectator (fan) is considered a participant.
 - Organiser: a person who is employed by the security company hired to provide security for the event at the venue and in connection with the provision of the event, and who can be identified in appearance as an organiser, and who has at least a qualification as a security guard.
 - Steward: the organiser may employ a steward on a voluntary basis, as an employee or under another employment relationship to carry out the tasks related to the organisation of the sports event. The role of the facilitator, as the representative of the organiser, shall be, in particular, to liaise with spectators and other participants in the sporting event, to provide information, to provide access to and orientation within the venue of the sporting event, to assist in the safe conduct of the sporting event and to assist in the use of the services provided at the venue of the sporting event. By law, only a person over the age of 18 with no criminal record may be a contributor.
 - Sporting event: a sporting event, competition, match and the hour and a half immediately preceding and the hour and a half immediately following it, whether or not in a competitive environment, for the purpose of a sporting activity.
 - Sporting event venue: the public place or defined area of public space where the sporting event is held and where spectators may be present.
 - Sports facility: a building or area used as a venue for a sports event.
 - Exclusion: the law requires the organiser, in the case of a sporting event organised with the participation of the organiser and the travelling sports organisation, and when an entry system is used, to refuse to sell tickets to the person removed from the sporting event and to prevent him/her from participating in the sporting event (exclusion). The organiser or the travelling sports organisation may exclude from participation in a sporting event organised by it or with its participation, whether at home or abroad, any person who has been removed from a sporting event organised by it or with its participation or who, when selling tickets or season tickets in his name, or issuing a certificate of admission or a voucher for the purchase of such tickets or season tickets, gives them to another person without authorisation, or who infringes the rules of the organiser or the travelling sports organisation or the general terms and conditions of the contract relating to the application for tickets, season tickets, club cards or vouchers, or who should have been removed from the area of the sports event but was not removed because the organiser (organiser) intervened at the venue of the sports event and could have caused a spectator act which would have disproportionately endangered the safety of the sports event.
